“Benefit Concert for Young Musicians”

The Civic Orchestra of Tucson presents its 4th Annual Benefit Concert and Silent Auction, with all proceeds supporting its 33rd Annual Young Artists’ Competition. This special event will take place on Tuesday, January 31, 2017, at the Tucson Jewish Community Center, 3800 E River Rd in Tucson. The Silent Auction begins at 6:30pm; the Concert starts at 7:00pm.

The featured Guest Soloist at this year’s Benefit Concert is percussionist and two-time competition winner, Trevor Barroero. The orchestra will also present the Powe Trio (Carissa Powe, violin, age 17; Levi Powe, cello, age 16; and Aliyah Powe, piano, age 15), who will perform movement two of Piano Trio No 3, by Édouard Lalo.

Concerts by the Civic Orchestra of Tucson are free, with the exception of its Annual Benefit Concert. General Admission tickets are \$20, available online or at the door, and \$5 Student Tickets are available at the door.

Each year, the Civic Orchestra of Tucson holds its Young Artists’ Competition. Musicians through high school age, some as young as 6 years old, compete for cash awards and an opportunity to perform a solo with the orchestra. The event provides each entrant a unique learning experience, and music teachers value the orchestra’s contribution to the young musicians’ development.
